Integrated Care Updates

Program of All Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) News

PACE Programs Are Now Included in the Plan Finder. For the first time, Medicare beneficiaries using the <u>PlanFinder</u> tool on Medicare.gov to identify the choices in their area will be able to see if PACE organizations are offered.

Changes in the Enrollment Process for New PACE Organizations. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued a Health Plan Management System (HPMS) email on September 25, 2015 announcing that new PACE organizations (POs) can begin accepting enrollments more quickly after their program agreements are signed. In the past, the earliest a PO could accept enrollments was two months into the future (specifically, the first day of the month after the month the contract was executed). With this HPMS email, CMS announced that POs whose contracts are executed by the mid-month MARx enrollment systems cutoff (typically the 20th of the month) could enroll individuals for the first of the following month. States may want to assess their systems' ability to accept enrollments in this earlier timeframe.

Enrollment in PACE Organizations. PACE organizations provide comprehensive medical and social services to frail, community-dwelling individuals age 55 and older, most of whom are Medicare-Medicaid enrollees. A new ICRC resource, PACE Enrollment by State and by Organization, September 2015, shows that there are currently 117 PACE organizations operating in 32 states enrolling a total of 33,003 individuals. States most active in PACE are: Pennsylvania (4,976 enrollees in 19 organizations); New York (4,858 enrollees in nine organizations); and California (4,354 enrollees in 11 organizations).

September 2015 Enrollment in Medicare-Medicaid Plans

Between August and September, total Medicare-Medicaid Plan (MMP) enrollment in the nine states (CA, IL, MA, MI, NY, OH, SC, TX, and VA) currently implementing capitated model financial alignment demonstrations rose from 389,629 to 397,165. As shown in ICRC's technical assistance tool Monthly Enrollment in Medicare-Medicaid Plans by Plan and by State, September 2014 to September 2015, most of this increase comes from Michigan, which saw a 24 percent rise in enrollment – from 38,850 in August to 48,108 in September.

October 15- December 7	Annual Coordinated Election Period, Medicare-only beneficiaries can enroll in Medicare Advantage or Medicare Part D plans (Medicare-Medicaid beneficiaries have a year-round special election period (SEP)).
